Otterpool Park (2018 – to present), (Folkestone and Hythe):

Sasha is part of a multi-disciplinary team responsible for shaping and guiding proposals for a 10,000 home garden town in Kent. An outline planning application for the site was submitted in 2019, the site was allocated in the Local Plan in 2021 and work is ongoing to inform the next stage of detailed design and the Section 106. Sasha has been involved in the project from the outset, leading on aspects relating to social infrastructure provision particularly healthcare and education facilities as well as the economic offer and role of the development.

East Wick and Sweetwater (2020 – to present), (LLDC): Sasha has developed a robust approach for measuring the social value of the development at East Wick and Sweetwater – part of the Legacy Community Scheme in LLDC. She worked with Get Living to understand their local and corporate objectives, assess how these have impacted on nearly a decade of development at East Village and understand how commitments have been embedded and realised on site. Her work is helping Get Living articulate and communicate their positive impact to a community, political and officer audience.
